*AFFIRMATION OF FAITH (from "A Declaration of Faith")

The Spirit enabled people of all races, classes, and nations to accept the good news of what God had done in Christ, repent of their sins, and enter the community of faith.

The Christian fellowship was not a society of perfect people.

The struggle between the old way of life and the new was severe.

Yet the Spirit produced among followers of Jesus

love, joy, peace, and victories in the battle against evil.

We testify that today this same Holy Spirit makes us able to respond in faith to the gospel and leads us into the Christian community.

The Spirit brings us out of death into life, out of separation into fellowship.
