Farmers use herbicides to help encourage growth of their crop, be it corn or wheat. They don't want the weeds to grow. Gardeners weed their chosen plot of land to encourage growth of their radishes and carrots, tomatoes and cucumbers. They don't want the weeds to grow. 
Growth is a fact of life. It is inevitable. What is not inevitable is exactly what will grow, and in what direction.
