Message from Pastor Bill Vincent

Sometimes it's harder than others. Especially not wanting to sound flippant, or superficial.

Scenes from the Israeli/Hamas war are devastating. Knowledge of the fear of the Israeli hostages, and the fear of Palestinian civilians, is overwhelming. News of anti-Semitism and anti-Muslim sentiment in this country is disheartening.

And then another mass shooting occurs. And the nasty political rhetoric continues. And the stock market heads south. And... And... And...

And it's November, and we're supposedly thinking of Thanksgiving: giving thanks. For what? That 'our side' has the bigger bombs? That our stocks are safe(r)? That the anger's not directed at me (at least for now)?

(Not the most uplifting start, is it?)

In times like these – especially in times like these – I am reminded of words from the prophet Habakkuk:

Though the fig tree does not blossom, and no fruit is on the vines; though the produce of the olive fails, and the fields yield no food; though the flock is cut off from the fold, and there is no herd in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the Lord; I will exult in the God of my salvation. (Habakkuk 3:17-18 NRSV)

Not exactly mirroring our present-day situation, but, I believe, pointing us in the right direction.

For we can give thanks that God is still God...even if we sometimes question what God is doing or how God is acting (or *if* God is acting).

We can give thanks that God still cares. We see evidence of that in our own lives...and in the acts of compassion and care exercised by others, even in the midst of horrors and deprivation.

We can give thanks that God hears are prayers - and we are praying, aren't we?

We can give thanks that God understands. God has seen – and experienced (remember the cross?) – the pain and anger, the isolation and rejection, the... God has seen it all. God understands.

This does not answer all our questions or all our agonizing cries of 'Why?' This does not solve all the complex issues that face us and the world. This does not relieve all the anxiety or take away all the fear.

But it does give us our grounding and our foundation – our *sure* foundation – from which to start and out of which we live...in hope.

For we can give thanks that God will guide us in our actions and decisions and responses: to do what we can with what we have to live out our faithfulness before God...and the world.

We can give thanks that God will be with us as we seek to respond with compassion and choose with wisdom and act with courage.

We can even give thanks when God directs us down paths with which we may feel uncomfortable...because God has promised to equip us for every challenge we face.

We can give thanks because we know, even in such times, God has not abandoned us and God still cares for us and God will go with us...and with others as well.

So let us give thanks to God...always.

And let us give ourselves into God's hands...always.

And let us trust God...always.

For God is good...even when it's difficult to see that.

And God is love...even when we might not feel that.

And God is with us – always – as we seek to follow God's way and share God's abundance and embody God's love...for all...for always.

Thanks be to God!
