PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION

SERMON "The Beat Goes On" by Pastor Bill Vincent

--[metronome on]--

The beat...goes...on. We may not hear it as clearly as this metronome here, but it is always there: steady, constant, continuous, faithful.

The beat goes on.

--[metronome off]--

And that is a challenge. Something to be reckoned with. For sometimes we are not ready, sometimes we want to hold onto things that can't be held onto. Yet the beat goes on ... whether we like it or not. We can try to fight it and resist it and deny it. Or we can accept it and live with it and be a part of it.

But the beat will go on – with, or without, us.

The beat goes on. And that is a comfort. Something to assure us in the midst of the uncertainties and shifts, changes and turmoil of life. The beat goes on ... and it will not die. The empty tomb assures us of that. We can ignore it and choose not to believe it. Or we can cling to it and claim it and put our faith in the God who says it is true.

For the beat will go on.

The beat goes on with the thrill of the Hebrews' crossing the Red Sea. It can be heard in the thundering hooves of Pharaoh's chariot horses. It can be heard in the shouts of praise from the people delivered.

And the beat goes on with the drudgery of wandering in the wilderness. It can be heard with the soft thud of each person's tired, sandaled feet. It can be heard in the wind blowing in the people's faces. It can be heard in the cry of quails offered as meat for the people. It can be heard in water gushing forth from a rock.

The beat goes on during the agony of the crucifixion. It can be heard in the wailing of the women at the foot of the cross. It can be heard in Christ's cry for mercy, even for those who hammered in the nails.

And the beat goes on with the resurrection. It can be heard in the echo of the empty tomb. It can be heard with the news of the angels, "He is not here!" It can be heard with the stunned silence of disciples who dare not believe yet want to believe and do not know what to believe.

"The beat goes on."

Life goes on.

But even deeper. Love goes on. And God goes on. And God goes with us, every step of the way as life goes on and on and on. For

God's steadfast love endures forever.

Raise your hand if you can remember the birth of your first child, or the birth of a sister or brother.

Raise your hand if you can remember the first day of school, whether the very first in your life or even the first of this past year.

Raise your hand if you can remember moving from one house to another.

Raise your hand if you can remember the death of someone you love.

They are all transitions. Times of shifting and change.

And whether good or bad, exciting or terrifying, desired or not, life went on, the beat went on. And it still does. And it still will.

Yes, we are affected, and even changed, by these transitions. But not destroyed by them. And if we learn to embrace them, even in sorrow, we can grow because of them, and become better people.

They may frighten us because of their uncertainty and the unknowns.

But as someone once said.

we do not know what the future holds, but we know who holds the future. (letter from The Session, Aledo First Presbyterian Church, Illinois)

The beat goes on

- -when we see it
- -and even when we do not.

The beat goes on

- -with a Book Club here and a band there
- -from a community garden to a community food pantry
- -with an anniversary or two and a retirement
- -as the old year comes to an end; as a new year is about to begin.

The beat goes on

- -with new names and new faces
- -and with old names and old faces in new places.

The beat goes on.

So we gather in worship and share in prayer and share something of our many and varied – yet ultimately singular – journeys.

And we hear the word and share the promise and remind each other of the beat.

For the beat goes on.

Let us listen for it – when it is loud and hurts our ears ... and when it is loud and a source of strength and confidence.

Let us listen for it – when it is soft and disappointing ... and when it is soft and soothing. Let us listen for it – when it grates on our ears and tears at our hearts and numbs our minds ... and when it calms our nerves and heals our hearts and fills us with joy.

The beat goes on.

Let us listen for it, and know that it is an echo of the heart-beat of God – the God who is with us and who loves us always ... for that's what it means that...
