All: We call this candle Hope.

(Light the first candle.)

We call this candle Peace.

(Light the second candle.)

We call this candle Joy.

(Light the third candle.)

We call this candle Love.

(Light the fourth candle.)

We call this candle Christ.

(Light the center candle.)

One: This baby will bring hope,

embody peace,

give joy,

and be God's love incarnate.

One: On this night, we welcome the Christ child,

Emmanuel, God with us.

We join our voices with the multitudes and heavenly host, exclaiming:

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace to all.

All: Lord, Jesus, we celebrate your birth among us again.

Alleluia!
